7:15 P.M. – OPEN PUBLIC HEARING LOCAL LAW NO. 3 FOR 2021-TAX CAP OVERRIDE

Supervisor Pangrazio declared the Public Hearing open at 7:15 P.M. for Proposed Local Law No. 3 For 2021 and asked Town Clerk Seth Graham read the Notice of Hearing for the record. Supervisor Pangrazio asked if anyone would like to speak at this time. No one from the Board had any comments at this time.

SUPERVISOR PANGRAZIO-TAX CAP OVERRIDE

Supervisor Pangrazio gave a brief overview of the Local Law. Due to uncontrollable cost and other unknowns, Supervisor Pangrazio and the Board felt that it was in the best interests of the Town to pass this Local Law. This Local Law is to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Town of Caledonia, County of Livingston pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c, and to allow the Town of Caledonia, County of Livingston to adopt a Town Budget for the fiscal year 2022 that

requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law §3-c.

DEPARTMENTS/COMMITTEES

ATTORNEYS – DWIGHT KANYUCK

Attorney Dwight Kanyuck updated the Board on the progress of the Horseshoe Solar project. The application is currently delayed. Invenergy is transitioning from Article 10 to the 94-c process for the review of their application. The planned meeting was postponed.

CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER – TOM PERKINS

Code Enforcement Officer Tom Perkins updated the Board on the following items:
