BUDGET DISCUSSION – SUPERVISOR PANGRAZIO

Supervisor Pangrazio discussed with the Board some of the changes that the Governor has made that will directly impact the 2022 Budget. The Property Tax Cap is permanent but at this time, we have not received the cap numbers. Revenues are down for the Town, and AIM (Aid Incentive to Municipalities) is not guaranteed. As a fiscally prudent manner, Supervisor Pangrazio stated that the Town will most likely have to pass a Local Law to override the Tax Cap as done in past years.

Supervisor Pangrazio explained that the funds can only be used for certain things, but he planned to apply, and it was a great opportunity for the Town. The Board recommended passing a resolution authorizing Supervisor Pangrazio to apply for the funds.
