JIM DUTTON - CALEDONIA FIRE DISTRICT

Negotiations on the land are on-going. Jim is seeking favorable feedback from the Board. The Board agreed that the Fire District should contact the Planning Board to get on their agenda for June.

STEVE WERNER – 2521 LEROY-CALEDONIA RD

Steve Werner is seeking to purchase a piece of property nearby an abandoned old railroad property that is currently owned by the Town of Caledonia. The Board advised him to contact Town Attorney Peter Skivington.
